



Hebrews 5:11-14
Living Bible

"There is much more I would like to say along these lines, but you don't seem to listen, so it's hard to make you understand."¹²⁻¹³ You have been Christians a long time now, and you ought to be teaching others, but instead you have dropped back to the place where you need someone to teach you all over again the very first principles in God's Word. You are like babies who can drink only milk, not old enough for solid food. And when a person is still living on milk it shows he isn't very far along in the Christian life, and doesn't know much about the difference between right and wrong. He is still a baby Christian!¹⁴ You will never be able to eat solid spiritual food and understand the deeper things of God's Word until you become better Christians and learn right from wrong by practicing doing right.

A greeting to all Judgment Day has finally arrived! God has finally focused on the earth during the Second Coming and will pronounce sacred

proclamations to all those that are seeking God. In a modern day letters to the seven churches relayed in the Book of Revelation we now read: ¹⁹ I correct and discipline everyone I love. Take this seriously, and change the way you think and act, Revelation 3:19. In relating to a call of judgment to the sheep that are scattered about the words of revelation tell us that we cannot possible just join the Lord as it was thought could happen, the nature of mankind has hardly been conquered by people on the earth. In the words of revelation the counsel is to take the matter seriously and repent of ways that do reflect sound Christian ways of thinking and behaving. Judgment Day has commerce and we are now expected to analyze our conduct that is in contradicted to Christianity.

The theme Bible passage of Hebrews 5:11-14 give us much to be serious about; our conduct should be sound in mind with all seriousness. This is in fact a Christian require and all those desiring to become Sons of God should have a certain degree of maturity. What passage in the Bible helps us take an honest look at ourselves? At 2 Peter 3:14-16 (Names of God Bible) ¹⁴ Therefore, dear friends, with this to look forward to, make every effort to have him find you at peace, without spiritual stains or blemishes. ¹⁵ Think of our Lord's patience as an opportunity for us to be saved. This is what our dear brother Paul wrote to you about, using the wisdom God gave him. ¹⁶ He talks about this subject in all his letters. Some things in his letters are hard to

understand. Ignorant people and people who aren't sure of what they believe distort what Paul says in his letters the same way they distort the rest of the Scriptures. These people will be destroyed. There are several points that need to be highlighted in this passage. First of all there are certain things that we should be completely sure about: to be at peace within our hearts and minds not like the world simmering about something or rather anything. Genuine peace is a Christian trade mark in a world that is full of emotional and physical upset, Philippians 4:4-7. Another point is to be without "stains" meaning sins against God's law as if you did not know what they are, Romans 12:1-2. No one is in fact perfect but there are limits that God has in how people live their lives every day, you should not go to worship and hear the laws repeatedly in a religious organization and then behave as if you did not know a right or wrong path in deciding to pursue a Christian course of live, James 1:22-25. It is truly wrong and weird to engage in sin and then at the same time hold the Bible in your hands so to speak, Titus 1:13-16.

The passage at 2 Peter 3:14-16 also refers to God's patience in allowing time for people to learn and grow into displaying a proper Christian conduct daily. The passage explains that we should consider it an opportunity for us to gain the right to obtain

salvation. This means to practice Christian law and works so that you can be worthy to gain eternal life, Ephesians 4:1-6. But why should this point be so important to us? In considering our Bible based training and how we are examining the Scriptures daily we are going to run into a common trait that each devout Christian will have to confront. By going on the read 2 Peter 3:14-16 it now says: *This is what our dear brother Paul wrote to you about, using the wisdom God gave him.* ¹⁶ *He talks about this subject in all his letters. Some things in his letters are hard to understand.* Okay this is again a point in our spiritual journey were we will all confront; we will find passages that are constructed for mature minds. Since we study what we can and mediate on these subjects we must be ready at some point to press on towards maturity. Once this point arrives we will know because we encounter things that are hard to understand, the concepts of Christian terminology that explain salvation to us as God wishes us to know. Okay it is easier now to recognize that God always had thoughts and ways that were higher than humans. This does not mean that God had changed in the way humans are confronted with learning salvations since of course we were made in God Image. This means that you have the ability to accept the

training that God has designed for us. However this will also mean that it is not easy.

Now we are going to speak of what has happened when humans have confronted the complex terms of teaching salvation. Humans nature has always prevailed here on earth, people have ignored, run around elaborated terms, they shrugged, changed the words around to make them sound like what they wanted to hear many things have happened when people care confronted with an issue for them. The ways that people have behaved tell you a lot about them and how they learn or do not learn. But this does not change the fact that God expects everyone to learn the Christian belief period, and exactly as it is seen. The reason for this is because it is called accurate knowledge. When the time comes for us to dig deeper into the Christian terminology complex we are expected to patiently read and memorize the information outline in the Bible in its original form, exactly like it is done in school. Simply because this helps us to follow the footsteps of Jesus Christ with stronger faith and trust. The personality changes that must be made are also connected to stronger faith, trust, and the correct knowledge of what salvation is and how we can acquire it from God when the time for

releasing it to mankind has arrived. In other words you are expected to be allowed into the Kingdom of the Heavens instead of being rejected as fake. In the final words of 2 Peter 3:14-16, how does it show that people have failed at learning the terms of Salvation? Ignorant people and people who aren't sure of what they believe distort what Paul says in his letters the same way they distort the rest of the Scriptures. These people will be destroyed.

The information God has relayed in the Bible to teach salvation is indeed complex since it strengthens the faith and builds trust these things are important when we partake of salvation since we do not know what is actually happening to our bodies. This is how God expects people to trust in him and not worry a detailed explanation already learned that expresses that we should not worry and everything will turn out fine. This is the job that religion takes up and each church should know how to handle God's word aright, 2 Timothy 2:15. What is actually happening now is that the focus has shifted to the teachings of each religion and if the words of each belief are accurately Christian Terminology. The Second Coming of Christ will expose this and each one should be able to judge the quality of the religion they belonged to. What passage in the Bible tells us what to look for when we are judging the religious teaching of the church that

we belonged to? At Hebrews 6:1 (Living Bible) 6 Let us stop going over the same old ground again and again, always teaching those first lessons about Christ. Let us go on instead to other things and become mature in our understanding, as strong Christians ought to be. Surely we don't need to speak further about the foolishness of trying to be saved by being good, or about the necessity of faith in God. As an introduction we taught that we should be good people and believe in God, this is only laying a foundation we should not simply repeat this over and over again as if it is the only thing that we know. People should know that they are required to be good moral sound people and reading the word of God regularly should strengthen faith that God is real, Hebrews 11:6. A clear picture of peoples conduct will show whether they are developing the correct faith in God. How does Hebrews 6:1 express how the church should develop the hearts of servants that they have been entrusted with? Let us go on instead to other things and become mature in our understanding, as strong Christians ought to be. An honest look would be to see a religion that rolls up their sleeves so to speak and dig into teaching more complex things at some point. Since this leads to building a stronger mindset of each servant that goes to the church, the religion is used to build strong Christians, John 21:15-17. In this way our understanding will become more mature because the

church itself set out to teach more complex matters, Matthew 15:3-11.

The church in the final days will be the epicenter in how the Christian beliefs are taught and spread around the globe because that is God's intentions when Jesus Christ founded The Way as a form of worship, Acts 9:2 and Acts 11:26. Even though there are many different kinds of religions on earth, Christianity will be the only true faith. In narrowing it down to which Christian sect is the true one, it can only be found by using and teaching Christian Terminology to all servants of the church, Ephesians 4:5. In our theme passage at Hebrews 5:11-14 we are going to focus on verse 12: *the very first principles in God's Word*. This will be an important part of how you will investigate your current religious beliefs and teachings by first of all identifying in the Bible exactly what the first principles are. What passage in the Bible helps us to acknowledge what the Sacred Pronouncements of God are? At Acts 7:37-43 (*Living Bible*)³⁷ "Moses himself told the people of Israel, 'God will raise up a Prophet much like me^[a] from among your brothers.'³⁸ How true this proved to be, for in the wilderness, Moses was the go-between—the mediator between the people of Israel and the Angel who gave them the Law of God—the Living Word—on Mount Sinai.³⁹ "But our fathers rejected Moses and wanted to return to Egypt."⁴⁰ They told Aaron, 'Make idols for us, so that we will have gods to lead us back; for we don't know what has

become of this Moses, who brought us out of Egypt.'⁴¹ So they made a calf idol and sacrificed to it, and rejoiced in this thing they had made.⁴² "Then God turned away from them and gave them up, and let them serve the sun, moon, and stars as their gods! In the book of Amos' prophecies the Lord God asks, 'Was it to me you were sacrificing during those forty years in the desert, Israel?'⁴³ No, your real interest was in your heathen gods—Sakkuth, and the star god Kaiway, and in all the images you made. So I will send you into captivity far away beyond Babylon.' In identifying the sacred words of God the Bible tells us that it started with Moses on Mount Sinai in which the newly freed Hebrews received the Ten Commandments and additional laws in the wilderness. The first sin made by the Israelites where that they rejected Moses and had a calf made to lead them back to Egypt. This means both God's word and the mediator of the word were completely rejected by the people, Exodus chapters 19-32. This is the story told in Acts 7 and the reaction that God had in see all this happen in the wilderness after the powerful works of saving this people. The Bible clearly states that God gave them up and let them worship the sun, moon and the stars. In looking closely at this passage at Acts chapter 7 we see a people that will simply not humble themselves and follow God and try to learn the ways of God. They immediately reject and rebel without much effort on their parts at all. Another fact is that they seemed not to be affected by the miracles of the ten plagues, the parting of the red sea, the death of

their enemies all of this is God's mighty hands to safeguard the people, Exodus chapters 5-15. In continuing with the look at Christian maturity on earth we will go forward in part two in to overlook the information of the theme passage of Hebrews 5:11-14.
