



John 14:6 (Living Bible)

⁶ Jesus told him, "I am the Way—yes, and the Truth and the Life. No one can get to the Father except by means of me.

This is one of the most famous Bible passages ever spoken by Jesus Christ, many of us have believed in Jesus as the Messiah and each time we read this excellent Scripture we are impressed. For nothing sounds more spiritual than this passage of the man that takes full responsibility for divine commission. The Bible is

the creation of God in which stories are told to give encouragement, to teach, to build hope through faith, 2 Timothy 3:16-17. The Character Jesus Christ was used to instruct the modern world and provide to promises that give hope of a better future. Since Jesus Christ is a tool used by God in different ways the passage above will be expounded to give meaning to us to the character Jesus of Nazareth who is called the Christ.

The New Testament of the Holy Bible tells the life and works of the character Jesus Christ. The four books give us detailed information on what Jesus did when he lived in Israel during the 1st century of our common era. Since it is very clear that Jesus Christ is a tool we will now focus on the passage above and give the general idea of what it means for us today. 'Jesus told him, "I am the Way' when we think of this passage we believe it means I am the way to God. What information in the Bible can help us understand what relationship Jesus had for servants of God during his mission? At John 10:7-15 [Easy-to-Read Version] Jesus Is the Good Shepherd⁷ So Jesus said again, "I assure you, I am the gate for the sheep."⁸ All those who came before me were thieves and robbers. The sheep did

not listen to them.⁹ I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved. They will be able to come in and go out. They will find everything they need.¹⁰ A thief comes to steal, kill, and destroy. But I came to give life—life that is full and good.¹¹ "I am the good shepherd, and the good shepherd gives his life for the sheep."¹² The worker who is paid to keep the sheep is different from the shepherd. The paid worker does not own the sheep. So when he sees a wolf coming, he runs away and leaves the sheep alone. Then the wolf attacks the sheep and scatters them.¹³ The man runs away because he is only a paid worker. He does not really care for the sheep.¹⁴⁻¹⁵ "I am the shepherd who cares for the sheep. I know my sheep just as the Father knows me. And my sheep know me just as I know the Father. I give my life for these sheep. The key point in this passage is that Jesus is used like a fine shepherd that cares for the flock of God. He is a person whom the sheep trust and follows, he truly cares for the flock and make sure that they are provided for. He expresses that he is simply not a worker that is paid wages for the care of the flock. But he came as an owner and nurtures the flock always.

Can we have confidence in the work that Jesus Christ was given by God that merits true success for our benefit? Yes at Romans 5:1-5 (Living Bible)
5 So now, since we have been made right in God's sight by faith in his promises, we can have real peace with him because of what Jesus Christ our Lord has done for us.² For because of our faith, he has brought us into this place of highest privilege where we now stand, and we confidently and joyfully look forward to actually

becoming all that God has had in mind for us to be.³ We can rejoice, too, when we run into problems and trials, for we know that they are good for us—they help us learn to be patient.⁴ And patience develops strength of character in us and helps us trust God more each time we use it until finally our hope and faith are strong and steady.⁵ Then, when that happens, we are able to hold our heads high no matter what happens and know that all is well, for we know how dearly God loves us, and we feel this warm love everywhere within us because God has given us the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts with his love. This passage has several points that can be acknowledged about Jesus Christ and what his character was given the job to do for humanity. We are formally in a position to accept salvation as a free gift and becoming completely worthy of this calling. We promote the development of the Christian personality through trials and tribulation to learn character. We can create a relationship with God that builds our confidence and reassurance of gaining salvation without hindrance.

What passage in the Bible helps us understand the work that the character Jesus Christ did to unite the entire world as one religion Christianity? At Ephesians 2:11-18 (Living Bible) "Never forget that once you were heathen and that you were called godless and "unclean" by the Jews. (But their hearts, too, were still unclean, even though they were going through the ceremonies and rituals of the godly, for they circumcised

themselves as a sign of godliness.)¹² Remember that in those days you were living utterly apart from Christ; you were enemies of God's children, and he had promised you no help. You were lost, without God, without hope.¹³ But now you belong to Christ Jesus, and though you once were far away from God, now you have been brought very near to him because of what Jesus Christ has done for you with his blood.¹⁴ For Christ himself is our way of peace. He has made peace between us Jews and you Gentiles by making us all one family, breaking down the wall of contempt* that used to separate us.¹⁵ By his death he ended the angry resentment between us, caused by the Jewish laws that favored the Jews and excluded the Gentiles, for he died to annul that whole system of Jewish laws. Then he took the two groups that had been opposed to each other and made them parts of himself; thus he fused us together to become one new person, and at last there was peace.¹⁶ As parts of the same body, our anger against each other has disappeared, for both of us have been reconciled to God. And so the feud ended at last at the cross.¹⁷ And he has brought this Good News of peace to you Gentiles who were very far away from him, and to us Jews who were near.¹⁸ Now all of us, whether Jews or Gentiles, may come to God the Father with the Holy Spirit's help because of what Christ has done for us.

The world formerly known as Gentiles, godless and unclean, became Christians along with the nation of Israel as heirs through faith in the blood shed by Jesus Christ. Faith in Christ made Jews and Gentiles a family of peace by the Law of Moses. The Good News was preached to both Gentiles and Jews that helped them confirm to the Christian faith as one for all those that believed.

What national role did the character Jesus Christ take up the promoted worldwide reconciliation with God? At Hebrews 10:19-25 (Living Bible) ¹⁹And so, dear brothers, now we may walk right into the very Holy of Holies, where God is, because of the blood of Jesus. ²⁰This is the fresh, new, life-giving way that Christ has opened up for us by tearing the curtain—his human body—to let us into the holy presence of God. ²¹And since this great High Priest of ours rules over God's household, ²²let us go right in to God himself, with true hearts fully trusting him to receive us because we have been sprinkled with Christ's blood to make us clean and because our bodies have been washed with pure water. ²³Now we can look forward to the salvation God has promised us. There is no longer any room for doubt, and we can tell others that salvation is ours, for there is no question that he will do what he says. ²⁴In response to all he has done for us, let us outdo each other in being helpful and kind to each other and in doing good. ²⁵Let us not neglect our church meetings, as some people do, but encourage and warn each other, especially now that the day of his coming back again is drawing near. The performance of the role as High Priest gave each servant of God's church a new life that grants us salvation with reassurance daily of our reward. We are encouraged to support each other as the end draws near.

How can we acknowledge the information of John 14:6 that says: 'yes, and the Truth', or the truth of God? At John 1:14-18 (Living Bible) ¹⁴And Christ became a human being and lived here on earth among us and was full of loving forgiveness* and truth. And some of us have seen his glory*—the glory of the only Son of the heavenly Father!*

¹⁵ John pointed him out to the people, telling the crowds, "This is the one I was talking about when I said, 'Someone is coming who is greater by far than I am—for he existed long before I did!'" ¹⁶ We have all benefited from the rich blessings he brought to us—blessing upon blessing heaped upon us! ¹⁷ For Moses gave us only the Law with its rigid demands and merciless justice, while Jesus Christ brought us loving forgiveness as well. ¹⁸ No one has ever actually seen God, but, of course, his only Son has, for he is the companion of the Father and has told us all about him. The four books on the life of Jesus Christ tell that he was full of forgiveness for people and their sins. When he lived on earth he never seriously reprimanded humans for their obvious imperfection and human failings, nor did he compete against them. This clear truth tells us everything that we will find in the Second Coming of Christ and what we should look for. The works of Jesus Christ, his preaching and teaching was honestly a blessing to the Jews first as well to the Gentiles. The passage above continues throughout the Holy Bible to acknowledge that the Father and the Son are one, when we read the New Testament we are looking at a human God who will take up the kingdom and provide salvation to the entire world, Isaiah 9:6-7. What passage in the Bible tells us the truth of why Jesus Christ came to minister to all on earth, Jews as well as gentile?

At Romans 15:7-13 (Living Bible) ⁷ So warmly welcome each other into the church, just as Christ has warmly welcomed you; then God will be glorified. ⁸ Remember that Jesus Christ came to show that God is true to his promises and to help the Jews. ⁹ And remember that he came also that the Gentiles might be saved and give glory to God for his mercies to them. That is what the psalmist meant when he wrote: "I will praise you among the Gentiles and sing to your name." ¹⁰ And in another place, "Be glad, O you Gentiles, along with his people the Jews." ¹¹ And yet again, "Praise the Lord, O you Gentiles; let everyone praise him." ¹² And the prophet Isaiah said, "There shall be an Heir in the house of Jesse, and he will be King over the Gentiles; they will pin their hopes on him alone." ¹³ So I pray for you Gentiles that God who gives you hope will keep you happy and full of peace as you believe in him. I pray that God will help you overflow with hope in him through the Holy Spirit's power within you. Jesus Christ came to prove to all the Jews that God's promises to the Hebrew Patriarchs are real and will be fulfilled using God's Kingdom. He also came to guide the gentiles into pure worship where they are united along with the Jews, Zephaniah 3:8-9.

What passage in the Bible teaches us that the way Jesus Christ lived his life is the truth of how God expects people to worship him? At Ephesians 4:20-24 (Easy-to-Read Version) ²⁰ But that way of life is nothing like what you learned when you came to know Christ. ²¹ I know that you heard about him, and in him you were taught the truth. Yes, the truth is in Jesus. ²² You were taught to leave your old self. This means that you must stop living the evil way you lived before. That old self gets worse and worse, because people are fooled by the evil they want to

do. ²³ You must be made new in your hearts and in your thinking. ²⁴ Be that new person who was made to be like God, truly good and pleasing to him. When we study the Bible and learn about the many acts and habits of Jesus Christ we learn the right way to approach God in worship and we are told to copy or follow this way of life because it reveals the truth to us about how our conduct should be like. With the help of the Holy Spirit we can be more exacting in our habits to be more Christ-like. The personality that Jesus Christ displayed is truly pleasing to God and he prefers us to continue following the life of his son exactly as we can comprehend it to be. As we continue to study the Bible and review the life and habits of Jesus Christ, how should we feel about the changes that we are making because of the things we are learning about in the Bible?

At Colossians 2:16-19 (Living Bible) ¹⁶ So don't let anyone criticize you for what you eat or drink, or for not celebrating Jewish holidays and feasts or new moon ceremonies or Sabbaths. ¹⁷ For these were only temporary rules that ended when Christ came. They were only shadows of the real thing—of Christ himself. ¹⁸ Don't let anyone declare you lost when you refuse to worship angels, as they say you must. They have seen a vision, they say, and know you should. These proud men (though they claim to be so humble) have a very clever imagination. ¹⁹ But they are not connected to Christ, the Head to which all of us who are his body are joined; for we

are joined together by his strong sinews, and we grow only as we get our nourishment and strength from God.

How does the Bible explain that Jesus Christ is life provided by God for all humanity? At John 1:4 (Living Bible) ⁴ Eternal life is in him, and this life gives light to all mankind. Jesus Christ had the ways that will lead to obtaining eternal life and this is what God has provided for all people, John 3:16. Faith developed in Jesus Christ as a believer was rewarded with eternal life as a gift from God. What information does the Bible have that tells us the Jesus Christ was a spiritual being and life came from the way he led his own life? At John 6:63 (Names of God Bible) ⁶³ Life is spiritual. Your physical existence doesn't contribute to that life. The words that I have spoken to you are spiritual. They are life. The spiritual campaigns of the works of Jesus Christ were truly focused spiritually and this helps all to see God's presence. How can we acknowledge the Bible and the information inside of it? At John 17:3 (Living Bible) ³ And this is the way to have eternal life—by knowing you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, the one you sent to earth! The stories and information in the Bible helps each student learn about God and the works of Jesus Christ which will lead to gaining eternal life. What passage in the Bible tells us

outright that God has something special for those that believe in him? At Romans 6:23 (Living Bible) ²³For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. In concluding this address and acknowledging the truth about the life that is provided to all from God what passages helps us move forwards in obtaining our spiritual goal of life forever? At Revelation 2:10 (Living Bible) ¹⁰ Stop being afraid of what you are about to suffer—for the devil will soon throw some of you into prison to test you. You will be persecuted for 'ten days.' Remain faithful even when facing death and I will give you the crown of life—an unending, glorious future.
